News from Bradleys Both Parish Council

The April meeting of the PC was our first to be held remotely via telephone conferencing. Despite trimming our usual business and conversation to the bare minimum, it was not easy. Some of us were talking in bathrooms, others from another planet, and some, though able to listen, couldn't get a word in edgeways, as they accidentally muted themselves. The Chairman, trying to keep order, found it difficult through lack of visual cues.

This month [7-30 pm, 19th May] we hope to use Zoom. Bradley residents, as always, are invited to listen, watch and join in during the public session. Details of access will be published on the PC website and noticeboards nearer the time. As a fallback, Mags now has the delegated authority to take decisions if all else collapses.

Despite the impression given above, the PC is very active. We are looking at the improvement and maintenance of our boundary with the Matthew Lane development; drawing up plans for the hard surfacing of the canalside carpark for which we have agreed funding; and have resumed grass cutting around the village before it gets unmanageable. Our draft neighbourhood plan has been independently assessed and we hope to have a final version shortly for submission.

Since the lockdown, I feel that our residents, and most of their dogs, have become friendlier and kinder to each other. That particular Yorkshire neighbourliness has become so much more evident, and I trust it will continue.

The charity runs an information & advice service which can provide free accredited advice on benefits and offers free benefits checks to make sure that older people are getting all of the support that they are entitled to. They can also offer a range of advice to help you deal with household bills, dealing with issues with suppliers and information about how to access banking services from home.
