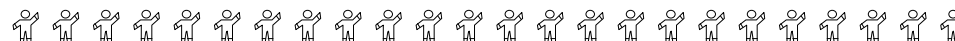

Latest News from Bradley In Bloom

Bradley in Bloom, in conjunction with Bradley Parish Council, have started rewilding some grass verges and other areas in Bradley. We have all become much more aware of the massive decline in our insect population over the years and, following guidance from the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust, we have started to allow some sections of grass in and around the village to grow wild that had previously been regularly cut. You may have noticed the yellow signs at the Heath and Ings lane entrances to the village. These areas are being allowed to grow wild with only a mowed strip on the roadside edge. There are also yellow signs in the amenity car park and picnic areas. It is envisaged that these areas will be managed to allow for the expansion of native wild flower species and eventually more areas of grassland will be rewilded over time. In the autumn these areas will be cut back to allow for reseeding and planting of native plug plants.



Great strides have also taken place at the village hall community garden, a volunteer led project to create a village resource of organic produce and to beautify our village hall. As well as the fantastic work undertaken by the enthusiasts involved, Bradley in Bloom would like to place on record their sincere thanks to some wonderful organisations and individuals who gave financial support, time and expertise to clear and reorganise the site. Skipton Building Society; Bradley Parish Council; Bradley Village Hall; Craven District Council and North Yorkshire County Council generously gave financial support towards buying sleepers and other materials. Myers Building Supplies also generously donated sleepers for the raised beds. Richard Throup and John Nelson did an amazing job of tree stump removal and disposal and Minstrels Nursery for their kind plant donations. For her "Captain Sir Tom Moore 100 Challenge", Millie Naisbitt made up packets of sunflower seeds, although they were free, a donation box was placed next to them in the village shop and Millie donated the money raised to Bradley In Bloom and it was used to purchase the bee signs. Jeff Ayrton and Ian Watkinson very kindly cut the sleepers



for the raised beds. Roger Hanson sold tomato plants at Bradley Village Store and donated the proceeds to Bradley In Bloom. We have also had donations of seeds for the community garden. Thank you so much to everyone who has given their support, it is very much appreciated and is making a huge difference.

Bradley In Bloom are holding a community garden open afternoon at the village hall on Saturday 17th July between 1.00pm and 4.00pm. You are warmly invited to come for a chat and have a tour of the new

Bradley Cricket Club Estd 1875

Dear Resident,

I am writing to you on behalf of Bradley Cricket club to inform you of our proposed plans to significantly increase the sporting options available at the village playing fields.

We intend to form a Sports and Social Club initially involving the Cricket Club, Football Club and the ladies Rounders Club, but would also be focused on extending sports activities at the playing fields to encompass a ladies cricket team, junior football teams and potentially junior rugby teams to make best use of the facilities all year round.

In order to achieve these objectives we need to enhance the buildings at the playing fields to provide adequate facilities for future participants in the sports proposed, this will require the replacement of the current pavilion with a larger building along with improvements to garages and secure storage buildings at the ground'

For this project to proceed we need a lease agreement from the Parish Council for the specific areas needed for the proposed development in order to be able to secure sources of funding needed to construct the buildings. We are already in contact with funding organisations who may be prepared to provide financial support if we have a lease as mentioned above.

If we can get the necessary agreements we believe we can deliver this project in 1 to 2 years which will give the village community a much improved sporting facility.

We would respectfully ask for your support in going ahead with this work as we strongly believe it will enhance the sporting activity for all members of the community both young and old.

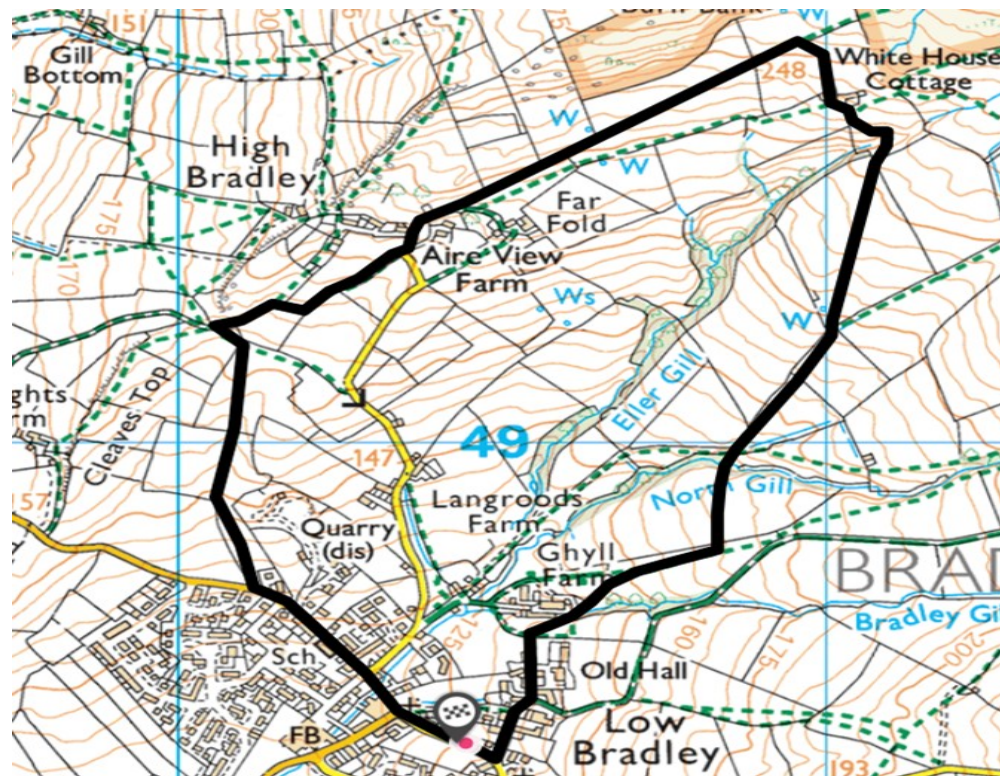
HIGH BRADLEY CIRCULAR WALK Full detail are on the website at bradleyillage.org and at the shop

Distance: 4.3km **Elevation Gain:** 144m / Medium Gradient

Surface: Fields, track and road

This 4.3km walk begins at the Village Hall with a steady climb up to enjoy the views from High Bradley. Return with a good downhill stretch through the fields and back into the village.

1. The walk begins at the Village Hall. Exit the car park onto the road and head briefly left up the hill.
2. Turn almost immediately left onto College Road and continue straight until you reach narrow gap between a wall and fence.
3. Pass through the gap and into the field. Walk to the small gate at the end.
4. Through the gate, head diagonally right up the field to the tree line above the houses at Ghyll Farm where you will find a gate.
5. Pass through the gate, down the steps and turn right through another gate. Head straight up this field until you reach a stile in the wall on your left next to a gate.
6. Climb the stile, then head almost straight across this field to the tree line opposite. You may have to walk up the hill slightly until you see a path running down into the trees where North Gill runs below.
7. Pass over the gill and through the stile in the wall. Walk straight up a small incline and pass over a wooden stile. Continue straight up this field, heading to the top left corner.
8. Here you'll find a stile. Climb over this and head diagonally right across the field to a gate in the top corner.
9. Through the gate, follow the track down and then up the field as it winds left and right up to the top left corner, just in front of White House Cottage.
10. Continue along the track until this starts to head downhill and bends left and then right near a group of houses.
11. Here you will find 2 gates to your right. Pass through the right hand gate and head down the grass track.
12. You will eventually come to a stile and gate on your left, with a stile directly opposite on your right. Take the stile to your left.
13. Over the stile, head immediately left toward the gateway.
14. Once through the gate, turn right to walk diagonally down the middle of the field where you will come to a wooden stile in the wall.
15. Over the stile, continue to head straight down the field where you will eventually reach the road.
16. Head over the stile, across the road and turn left along the pavement.
17. Continue down the road, past the Village Shop and back up the hill where you will return to the Village Hall on your left.



PLEASE FOLLOW THE COUNTRYSIDE CODE

- Consider the local community and other people enjoying the outdoors
- Park carefully so access to gateways and driveways is clear
- Leave gates and property as you find them
- Follow paths but give way to others where it's narrow
- Leave no trace of your visit, take all your litter home
- Keep dogs under effective control.
- Where livestock is in fields, keep dogs on a lead.
- Dog poo - bag it and bin it
- Follow advice and local signs and obey social distancing measures
