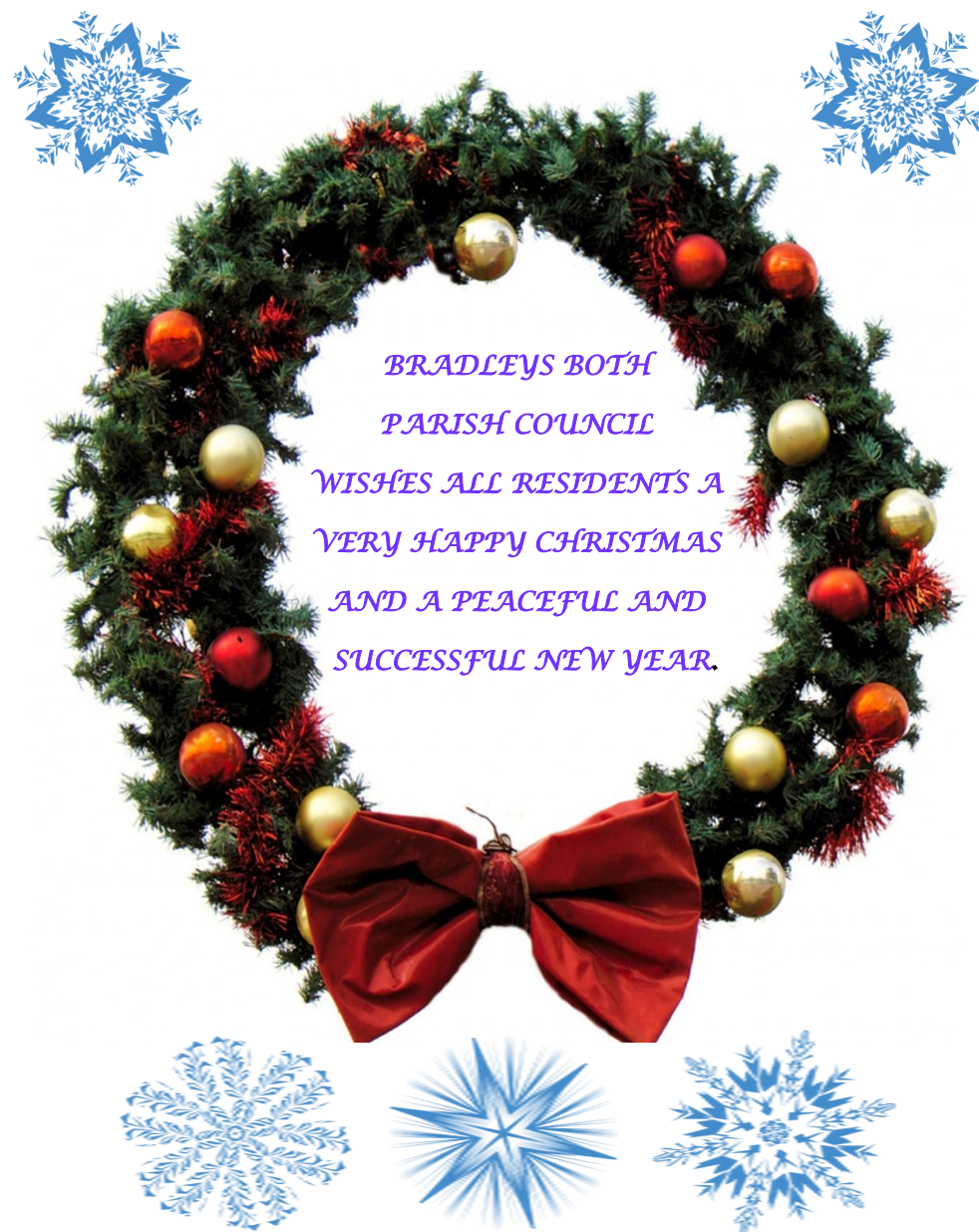

Chair's update

The arrival of Storm Bert has caused widespread disruption across the country and is a timely reminder that weather-related events of this type are likely to become more common with the progress of global heating. It is also increasingly apparent that the extent to which communities such as our own can rely on central and local government will be limited in the future: quite simply, neither have unlimited resources. Your Parish Council firmly believes that local communities should, so far as possible, try to make their own arrangements to provide support and assistance with both disruptive events and with at least some of the day-to-day business of looking after our village.

To this end, the Parish Council has launched a volunteering initiative led by Councillor Veronicka Dancer in an attempt to harness locally available skills to the benefit of all of us. You will find details elsewhere in this edition of Bradley News but the Parish Council would urge all its readers to pause and consider the areas in which they might be able to assist. Our ability to deal with major national events such as Storm Bert will, of course, be limited but every bit of local effort can, potentially, make a difference.

Other local news includes the welcome promise that RN Wooler will shortly re-start their long-delayed work on the canalside development. Other planning issues include the development of the Skipton Road site. RN Wooler's planning application to develop the site is currently still under consideration by North Yorkshire Council and, no doubt, a decision will be made before long. In the meantime, central government has almost doubled the number of new houses it expects to be built in North Yorkshire despite cross-party protest from North Yorkshire's councillors. Clearly, planning and house building is an issue which is going to remain with us for some time to come.

The Parish Council was saddened to learn of the demise of the Bradley Football Club. It is to be hoped that the club can be revived in some form or other in the near future but, like the volunteering initiative, that will require local support. The playing fields were given to the Parish Council by Harold Green in 1976 to '... use as a playing field and area of public recreation in perpetuity for the inhabitants of the... Parish.' They form a valuable resource for the community and the Parish Council would like to see the fullest possible use of them by and for the benefit of the village.

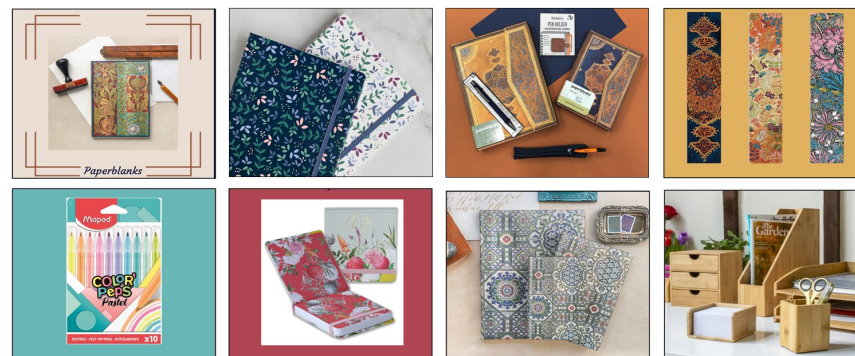
That will include, in particular, the reconstruction of the playground – a subject which attracted much lively comment at the village open day in October – but that will come at a significant cost and will necessitate a considerable fund-raising effort by the Parish Council and the community at large.

That leads on to the Parish Council's budget for the coming year, 2025/26, which is now under active consideration. The annual precept received by the Parish Council is around £22,000 and constitutes by far the largest part of our income. It is spent in large part on the maintenance of property owned by the parish council including, in the current year, the repair of damage caused to the cricket pavilion by a water leak (approx.£3,000), Yorkshire Water's bill for the water used during the leak (£4,000, although we have secured a reduction) and the replacement of one of several lamp posts owned by the Parish Council in High Bradley Lane (£1,500).

Bradley In Bloom

The work on the development of the community orchard at Sweet Croft meadow, below Bradley Cemetery, continues.

Volunteers have cleared around each fruit tree and applied compost to give the trees a good start next season. Over the next few years fruit will be available to Bradley residents.



Members have decided to rename Bradley in Bloom in order to better reflect the broad nature of its purpose, which includes protecting the biodiversity of the parish. Over the coming months the new name will be used. We will call the group:

BRADLEY ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP

We now take care of six small areas in the parish as meadow land. These areas are becoming rich with wild flowers and insects, which will not only be attractive, but support our bird and small mammal populations.

We are currently discussing with Bradley Parish Council the possibility of setting up a community garden hub (hut) building near the existing community garden to the rear of the village hall. This would be a large enough to provide the following:

- Meeting hub for Bradley Environmental Group volunteers.

- Friendship hub for our community.

- Talking space for small gardening & environmental groups.

- Workshop space for small groups of children and adults.

- Potting up plants and swapping seeds /plants.

- Community events, including apple press days, providing apple juice to the village.

- Notice board of upcoming events, available produce & recipes.

This proposed project is designed to provide a focal point for the maintenance and protection of our fragile environment, support endeavours which beautify our village and activities which allow community spirit to flourish.

Our District Councillor, Andy Brown, has already pledged his support, subject to Bradley Parish Council's approval.



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BRADLEY FOOTBALL CLUB

After 53 years Bradley Football Club has had to disband. The current club was formed in 1971. For two seasons now the team has played away from Bradley whilst efforts have been ongoing to improve the playing surface at the playing fields. The Parish Council had secured a Football Foundation Grant, and a contractor had been selected to carry out works in Spring 2025 which would have enabled the team to return home for season 25/26. It is, therefore, even more regrettable that the Club has been unable to survive long enough to see this long-awaited return.

At this level of football there are two essential elements. Firstly, there must be an organising committee & officers, secondly there must be sufficient players registered to ensure that you are always able to field a team despite injuries and unavailability. For the last 10 years we have been restricted to one team. Despite the pandemic, the feeling within the club was optimistic for the future. However at the end of last season we lost 6 players who had been consistently available. During the summer we recruited new players and on paper we had at least 18 to 20 players who you would expect to be available most weeks. However, by late September/early October it was becoming apparent that we were struggling with availability. We had a further meeting and decided that this was not sustainable financially and without commitment from players, the second element of running a football team at this level, we would have to withdraw the team from the League. It was with great reluctance that this decision was taken.

I would like to thank all those who in recent times have helped the Club. In particular Ben Ramsden & Andrew Waite for their efforts in the face of the difficulties. I also would like to thank The Parish Council for their support, and Richard Webster of the Cricket Club.
